I AM A CHURCH MEMBER

"God did not give us local churches to become country clubs where membership means we have privileges and perks. He placed us in churches to serve, to care for others, to pray for leaders, to learn, to teach, to give, and, in some cases, to die for the sake of the gospel." — Thom Rainer, "I Am a Church Member"

n April 21, we are beginning a sermon series called "Every Member Matters." There is a lot to unpack in just those three simple words. Let's go in reverse order.

MATTERS

3rd person present: be of importance; have significance.

There are a few ways we can understand present-tense verbs. In this case, "matters" doesn't mean you are only important in this present moment, but continually. No matter when you joined the church, how long you have been a member, or even if you join another church, you have worth and significance in the kingdom of God and in your local congregation.

There are numerous ways to understand this truth. First, you are infinitely significant because God creat-

ed you, loves you, and sent Jesus to die for you. This could technically be said about every person who has ever lived. You matter to God, and so you matter to the church!

That's the second way we interpret this truth. You are an important part of Holy Cross! Christ describes his church not as a gathering of people but as a body. Our bodies have many different parts, and each plays a different role, but every single part of the body is significant.

If you've ever gotten a splinter in your pinky, you understand this. You have nine other functioning digits, but when one of them is out of commission, it affects everything you do.

Maybe you're a pinky in the church. Maybe you are a hand. Maybe you are the lungs. Every member matters to the whole body. One cannot say to the other, "We don't need you," because then the body would not be complete.

MEMBER

noun: 1. a person belonging to a particular group. 2. an essential piece of a complex structure.

I have a Costco membership. I had to pay money to get it. Because I'm a member, I have access to all the exclusive deals they offer. If you don't have a Costco membership, sorry, you can't receive any of their benefits.

I've never been a member of a country club, but I've had friends who were. Because of my relationship with them, I've been able to benefit vicariously through them, but I never really belonged.

Some people view church membership in that sort of way. That in order to belong to the church, you have to pay your dues or put in a certain amount of time. But nothing could be further from the truth.

Constitutionally, we do distinguish voting members from others, but

when it comes to the things that truly matter—the gifts that God gives to his people—they are available and accessible to you in abundance and at no cost to you.

One of these gifts includes belonging. In most groups you may belong to, you have chosen to be a part of them based on similar interests, hobbies, skills, etc. Despite the diversity of backgrounds, likes and dislikes, skills, hobbies, and interests within the church, we find unity in Christ alone.

Back to the body analogy. The lung has a different function than the heart, but both need each other, and the whole body benefits from their different functions. And so, though all members of the body are different, they are all one body.

That's what it means to belong to the church. Without you, we would not be complete, and we would not be whole.

Take note of those last two words. No one in our church body is more important than another. God loves every person. Christ died for every person. You are loved by God without exception. There is nothing that can separate you from God's love in Christ Jesus.

This also means every member, from the youngest to the oldest, from the newcomer to the lifelong member, matters equally.

Every member matters.

Maybe you don't feel that is true. And there could be a variety of reasons why that's the case, but if that's true for you, I'm sorry.

If I have done or said something that has caused you to feel that way, I'm sorry. I'd love a chance to talk with you about what you've experienced so we can move forward together.

If you feel excluded in some way because of what someone else has said or done, I'm sorry. That's certainly not what we want anyone to feel. I'm available to talk with you and see where we can find resolution and restoration.

In some instances, you may not feel like you belong because you have excluded yourself. If that's the case, I want you to know that you are always welcome and that you belong. I'd welcome a chance to talk with you more about why that is without judgement. But also, in love, I encourage you to reengage. Because we aren't the same without you. The body needs you!

I look forward to exploring this more with you in our series, "Every Member Matters." •
