


PEACE OF THE LORD John 20:19

# Gbarnga Lutheran Mission Project, Inc.

("Gbarnga Mission") is constructing and staffing a school called the Gbarnga Lutheran Training Center (GLTC) to provide primary, secondary, and vocational education for impoverished families. Our mission is to share God's love as we facilitate Christcentered education, community development, economic opportunity, and health initiatives in rural Liberia. More specifically, our main purpose is to provide a Christian education for the children in the village of Deanville and its surrounding communities south of the city of Gbarnga, Bong County, Liberia. Gbarnga (pronounced "BONG-ah") is the second most populous city in Liberia with nearly 45,000 inhabitants. Located approximately 120 miles northeast of the capital city, Monrovia, it continues to struggle from the effects of war with no municipal electricity, water or sanitation systems. It is surrounded by poor, mostly agrarian, villages such as Deanville, that have no schools or government services. Through the generosity of donors, GLTC is educating children, providing clean drinking water and a nutritious meal each day – all while sharing Jesus' love for them.



Jon Rossman is President and CEO of Gbarnga Mission. He is formerly co-founder of Product Insight, Inc. — a Boston area product development firm — and currently owns and operates Details Carpentry — a residential remodeling company in Chelmsford, MA. He has planned and participated in numerous short-term mission trips both domestically and internationally including building projects in Central Appalachia, the Gulf Coast, Mexico, Haiti, and Nicaragua. Since his first trip to West Africa in 2014 he has spent over a year living in Liberia overseeing all aspects of the mission. He and his wife, Kathy, enjoy hiking, traveling, and ethnic foods.
