FROM OUR VACANCY PASTOR

Let's celebrate life's journey together with a special Valentine's Day ceremony

February is usually a dreary month for me. With the Super Bowl on February 7, football will be over for another season. Baseball hasn't started yet and I don't follow professional basketball or hockey. And the weather is usually less than great.

One bright spot is Valentine's Day! For husbands, this usually means the obligatory cards, candy, and flowers. And if possible (considering limitations of Covid) dining at one's favorite restaurant. It also affords the opportunity to reaffirm wedding vows that may have been made years ago.

One of the traditions in my previous parish was to enable couples to affirm their wedding vows during a church service. Couples whose wedding anniversary years fell on a multiple of "5" were first invited to loan an original wedding photo, which was put on display in the narthex. Then, on the Sunday closest to February 14, those couples would be invited during the worship service to come forward and stand before the altar and reaffirm their wedding vows.

It was always a meaningful and emotional experience. There were couples celebrating more than 50 years joined by couples that had been married recently. Facing each other and holding hands, they would hear the question,

Do you take this man/woman to be your husband/wife? Do you promise to be true to him/her in good times and bad, in sickness and health, to love and honor him/her all the days of your life, answer – I do?

Some answers were loud and clear; others were soft and muffled. There were often tears – by both men and women. Frequently, their children would be paying rapt attention, never having heard their parents vocally declare their love and devotion to each other. When the rite was over, the couples would face the congregation that always erupted with thunderous applause.



I would like to do this at Holy Cross this year as Valentine's Day falls on a Sunday.

Couples are invited to bring a wedding photo to church on either January 24 or 31. They may also bring them to the church office on Tuesdays or Thursdays between 8 a.m. and 1:30 p.m., no later than February 4. These photos will be displayed in the narthex on February 7 and 14.

At the appropriate time during the service on February 14, couples will be asked to stand in their pew and participate in this brief ceremony. Those remaining at home could participate as well. And yes, gentlemen, when finished, you may kiss the bride!

In addition to the church service ceremony, it would be an opportunity for all Holy Cross couples to reflect on their life's journey together – thanking God for the many blessings received down through the years – and rededicating themselves to remain in loving service to each other and their families.

2021 ANNUAL MEETING REVIEW

Holy Cross members tackle their urgent affairs, including pastoral call, officers and finances

The annual meeting of Holy Cross Lutheran Church had the usual business as well as one topic of high interest when it was held for the first time in "virtual" fashion in President Sherry Duff's debut in leading it. Due to Covid-related, social-distance restrictions, the meeting was held in Zoom online style. Of prime importance were an update on the pastoral-call process to fill the church's almost year-and-a-half vacancy, 2021 budgets, and election of officers. There was also the rare involvement of a vacancy pastor, the Rev. William Meyer, who has faithfully and beautifully led HCLC since the fall.

President Duff called the meeting to order at 10:04 a.m. on January 23 with attendees present on screen, which sadly prevented them from feasting on the fattening brunch food normally spread out in the Froehlich Fellowship Hall courtesy of the Board of Directors. Following an opening prayer by the President, she gave some welcoming and opening remarks and reviewed the agenda. Kerry Geffert was announced as Parliamentarian. A quorum was present with 55 linked in.

The agenda continued with the approval of the meeting minutes from the 2020 Annual Meeting and the December 5, 2020, Congregational Call meeting. That was followed by reports from the individual commission directors, who spoke about what their commissions had done during the challenging health crisis in 2020. In order they were: Worship/Sally Finck; Shepherds/Pat Deloge; Social Ministry/Stephanie Helminger & Kendra Norman; Discipleship/Kathy Boivie & Adela Buck; Education/Kristen Messerschmitt; Evangelism/Dave Bogen; Property/Dan Senft, and Technology/Gary Messerschmitt.

Next up was the election of seven officer positions: Treasurer, Greg Dowling*; Secretary, Michele Van Wart (the former president making a return to the Board); Social Ministry, Kendra Norman* and one Open codirector; Property, Dan Senft*; Technology, Gary Messerschmitt*. The Evangelism and Third-Year Shepherd positions are Open (for YOU perhaps!); Ms. Deloge is staying on as Lead Shepherd. With Ms. Finck departing the Worship Director position in mid-term, the Worship and Vice President positions are open with one year remaining before they are up for election. There were no nominations from the floor, whereupon it was moved that the entire slate be approved as presented and the motion carried. Coming off the Board were Ms. Helminger (Social Ministry), Dave Bogen (Evangelism) and Cliff Schrock (Secretary). *denotes incumbent.



The next order of business was the "joy" of any annual meeting—the financials. Financial Secretary Mr. Helminger presented income numbers for 2020. The total member giving, including envelopes, flowers, memorials, and dedicated accounts, was \$292,264 with Share the Hope income of \$30,000 plus. He said two-thirds of giving was done online. Treasurer Greg Dowling then reviewed the income and expense comparison. Church actual total income for 2020 was \$326,656.23, including PPP loan, and expenses \$290,495.75 for a surplus of \$36,160.48. Preschool actual expenses were \$212,687.66 versus actual income of \$190,205.34 for a deficit of \$22,482.32, the first year since 2017

the Preschool did not have a surplus. Mr. Dowling then went over the 2020 budgets for church and Preschool. Proposed church income was \$329,072.51 versus expenses of \$329,072.51 for a balanced budget. Budgeting for a new pastor was included for after the first quarter. For the Preschool, proposed income was \$216,662.00 versus expenses of \$215,178.48 for a surplus of \$1,483.52. The budget proposals called for flat totals for the most part, plus a 1.5 percent increase in salaries; this reflects the District's recommendation for church staff. A motion to pass the budgets as presented carried.

The topic of great interest was under Old Business. President Duff went over the most recent Call process that was made to Pastor Kevin Leidich of Kentucky. He was issued the call on December 5 and the President spent 20 minutes going over a timeline step by step on how the subsequent seven weeks played out in which Rev. Leidich chose not to respond to the call. This occurred with the involvement of not only District President Yeadon but with Circuit Counselor Morris as well as multiple meetings with the Holy Cross Board of Directors. The President said a new Call Committee will be refreshed and it was her goal to have two candidates to be voted upon when there is a next Call congregational meeting. (See page 9 for commentary on the Call portion.)

Under New Business, the next topic was tied in with the Missouri Synod 2019-2022 triennium. The members voted "yes" on a LC-MS proposal to add an extra year to the triennium due to the Covid-19 virus. This would allow districts to hold their conventions in either 2021 or 2022 and move the upcoming national Synod Convention from 2022 to 2023. ... During an open discussion, it was explained that an in-person Ash Wednesday service would be held on February 17. Midweek Lenten services would not be held in person but a virtual soup supper and evening devotion/Bible study would go forward on five Wednesdays thereafter leading to Holy Week. ... Appreciation was also expressed to Pastors Meyer and Flammann and to Circuit Counselor Morris for their help in Holy Cross' functioning and Call process. ... Pastor Meyer gave remarks in which he fully endorsed what had been said by President Duff about the Call process outcome and said she and Holy Cross had "dealt with a delicate situation with distinction." As he continues with his association with Holy Cross as Vacancy Pastor, he said he looks forward to the months ahead in ministry.

The meeting was adjourned at 11:59 a.m.



FROM THE MANAGING EDITOR

The Annual Meeting's most electric moment wasn't about a success but here's what it can teach us

It wasn't like the business of the first 80 minutes of the Holy Cross Annual Meeting wasn't important or critical for the Year 2021. Officer elections and budgets are certainly necessary. But at 11:20 a.m. when President Sherry Duff reached Old Business on the agenda, there was a sense that this was the topic the nearly 60 people on the Zoom meeting were really waiting for. Old Business was to focus on a Call Process Update.

For the next 20 minutes, President Duff gave as engrossing and fervent a report as has likely ever been presented at a HCLC Annual Meeting as she updated the attendees on the Call made from Holy Cross to Rev. Kevin Leidich. To be

sure, this Call was unlike any most of us had been involved with before. As a member of the Board of Directors at the time, I was aware of the narrative Ms. Duff was going to announce, which was that after first hearing of our Call on December 5, Pastor Leidich had ultimately chosen not to respond to it after we had dialogued with him about concerns Holy Cross members and staff had after his visit to Trumbull. In spite of our best efforts and with counsel from District leaders, we concluded that this Call did not bring the desired result.

I'm sure if we had all been in the Fellowship Hall as we normally would no one would have moved a muscle as Ms. Duff explained the timeline with heartfelt passion that was enthralling even though it would conclude with the news the Call was not being fulfilled with a Pastor coming to Holy Cross.

Ms. Duff had been resolute in a full explanation of the process details and when she finished at 11:40 and asked for reaction I imagine everyone had to do what I did and that was to sort of snap out of being in a suspended state of mind over what I had just heard. Perhaps some

members suspected something wasn't right with the Call and felt relief. The President is someone who puts her heart and soul into her mission and it had been an emotional retelling that this Call had led to this downer of an ending. Again, if we could have been in the same room, some members might have gone forward to give her a hug. But slowly messages came in through "chat" and some verbal replies of love and support and comfort were said. They were meant for her but at that moment Holy Cross itself needed a collective hug—the many Call Committee members, in particular, needed to

know they were being held close in everyone's hearts for their work and dedication to the task they had performed.

We've now had two call committees do due diligence for a Call and neither one has resulted in a new Shepherd. I believe the most common take on what the meaning of this Call meant for Holy Cross going forward is that these were not failures but were heavily influenced by the Covid crisis, which reduced the field of candidates who are willing to move at this time. Also, as we know, our time isn't always God's time. Perhaps that is why we have been blessed by God with such wonderful interim/vacancy leaders in Pastors Flammann and Meyer. We have been beautifully led by these two men as we work through the tedious Call process—twice! God has given us stability while we wait. We can do nothing but use this as a learning time to be inspired to work for the church and be diligent. Stay focused on the task of seeking His will.

At the conclusion of the President's report on the Call we made to Pastor Leidich, the pause that took place before responses spoke loud and clear to me. Our members were in tune with what took place, took it in, and were ready to move forward with the next step. We are keeping our heads above water. Holy Cross will not be dismayed or held back by this but will keep the faith that its next Shepherd is still waiting to be discovered.
