New Year's Wish List



COVENANT TO CARE FOR CHILDREN

Thank you to all those who donated Christmas gifts to our social worker's "caseload children"

Extra joy and love for Christmas. Surely that is what the 30 children who fall under the watchful care of DCF must have felt due to the special gifts they were given from members and friends at Holy Cross. Each child not only received a special gift – something that they particularly wished for – but also got a gift bag with a winter hat and mittens/gloves. On December 15 our social worker Mimose Laurenard arrived at Holy Cross to load up her van with the gifts, with plans to begin delivery that afternoon prior to our area's first big snowfall. I relate these two things with you: First, that Mimose was so emotional and nearly speechless seeing all the gifts, and second, that I feel terrible for not taking a picture of all the gifts lined up against the north-side door prior to loading them into Mimose's van.

I also share with you that the reception our Holy Cross family gave to the annual "Giving Tree" project during this year of uncertainty, brought on by COVID, was in one word: OVERWHELMING! Many members contacted me ahead of the November 15 "unveiling" of the "Giving Tree" to ask to be matched up to a child. By November 22, all 60 ornament tags had been taken and by December 9 all 60 gifts had arrived and were ready to be wrapped. Happy New Year! After more than a week off for the Christmas and New Year's holidays, we are getting back into the school routine. In January we will be exploring the season of winter. We will have an in-depth study of animals in the

winter and how they survive. We will learn which ones migrate, hibernate or if they stay around as usual. The children will learn what makes snow, as well as the process of freezing and melting. We are also teaching the children the correct way of writing all the letters of the alphabet. We use the "Fundation" writing program that makes it fun and simple.

As of this writing, we currently have 34 children enrolled with two new children to begin on January 4. Praise God!

Often we want to be able to see into the future. We say, "How will next year be for me? Where will I be five or 10 years from now?" There are no




answers to these questions. Mostly we have just enough light to see the next step — what we have to do in the coming hour or the following day.
