FROM OUR INTERIM PASTOR Dear Members & Friends of Holy Cross,

Christ is Risen! He is Risen Indeed, Alleluia!

I spent my last 11 years of pastoral ministry before "retirement" serving a congregation in northern Virginia, just outside the nation's capital, Washington, D.C. It was a fairly large congregation, but in terms of size it paled in comparison to the "big box mega-church" a few miles down the road, McLean Bible Church. Their pastor of many years, Lon Solomon, no longer serves there, but he was extremely well known in the greater Washington area for two things. First, he was heard on many a local radio station during drive time for a one-minute ad called "Not a Sermon – Just a Thought." Second, their worship service was aired on Sunday mornings, and about two-thirds of the way through a sermon, after expounding on a biblical text, he'd stop and say to the congregation, "Okay, are

you ready? Good. Now, on the count of three, I want you to ask the most important question. One-two-three...," and the people would shout out, "SO WHAT?" If the response wasn't sufficiently loud and enthusiastic, he'd ask them to shout it again, "SO WHAT?"

Now, let's you and I switch seats. You be the preacher. I'll be the hearer. Tell me what Easter is all about. I'll listen politely, but I'll also ask, "So what?" What's your answer?

I'll bet many of you have good answers, but if your response is hard to come by, let me see if I can help. Do the following words sound at all familiar?

"...that I may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom and serve Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness."

They're from Martin Luther's <u>Small Catechism</u>, where he provides an explanation to the second article of the Apostles' Creed, the one that deals with the person and work of Jesus Christ and God's gifts through Jesus. The "so what" has to do with how we see ourselves and how we shall live our lives in response.



First, it's recognizing that we belong to Jesus, the Risen One who has freed us from sin, death, and the power of the devil. We live under His lordship. Then, because we belong to Him, it's no longer a matter of what we "gotta do;" rather, it becomes all about what we "get to do." We get to live and serve [our God, His world, and our neighbor] because we belong to Him.

Because of Easter, we get to serve! During this ever-so-disruptive pandemic season, how will you serve? How will you maintain relationships of loving and caring? How will your personal outreach have an effect upon others? How will your personal stewardship and life management demonstrate that the Risen One is Lord of your life? So many questions, but I invite you to live into the "so what" of Easter and, as we anticipate elusive "normalcy," give thought to how life shall be as we "get to" live our lives in the light of Jesus' resurrection.



BUILDING OUR CONGREGATIONAL COMMUNITY DURING SOCIAL DISTANCING

Consider this proposal for how you can enhance our Christian ties

It can be challenging to retain our equilibrium, even our spiritual equilibrium, when so much of what makes us a Christian community has been rendered impossible for a season. We are accustomed to gathering for prayer and worship, but now we need to do these things in a different way.

<u>Here's a proposal and suggestion</u>. Please prayerfully consider doing this, and as you're led to do so, do it! Together let's make the most of our current challenge and build up our congregational community through prayer and love.

- 1. Identify three Holy Cross individuals or households, at least one of which you may not know very well, and begin to pray for them intentionally and daily.
 - a. Pray for their wellness: physical, spiritual, emotional, and relational.
 - b. Pray that they not lose heart during the Covid-19 challenge.
 - c. Pray for those who love them, that each may know the support of others.
 - d. Pray that, over time, you come to know them or to know them better.
- 2. After a few days, contact them by telephone or email to let them know you are praying for them. Ask whether there is anything in particular for which you might offer prayer.
- 3. After a week or two, send them a card or note of encouragement.
- 4. See if you can commit to having a visit together coffee or something else once the crisis is behind us.
- 5. Continue, over time, to be connected in some way. And continue to pray for the life of our entire congregation!

HOLY CROSS CHRISTIAN PRESCHOOL

Despite challenges, teachers create and post videos to engage children with learning activities

HE IS RISEN! ALLELUIA! With great joy we celebrated Easter last month, albeit in a very different way! We rejoice that Jesus overcame death and grants us the promise of new life through His death and resurrection!

As of March 13, our preschool has been closed, along with our church and the Trumbull Public Schools, due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Like the public schools we are now distance learning. Distance learning in early childhood

presents its own unique challenges...preschool children learn though hands-on exploration while being active participants with their environment and with other children. So much of our instruction focuses on not only learning activities but socialization and peer relationships. How do we do this online? We all stepped out of our comfort zone to meet the needs of the children we serve. Our dedicated teachers have risen to the challenge and are, in turn, learning along with the children! Our school has its own YouTube channel where we post daily videos from the teachers. We record ourselves reading stories, singing songs and conducting "Circle Time"



learning activities. We are also providing daily detailed lesson plans with activities that the children and parents can do together with things they already have at home. Preschool children cannot and should not spend a lot of time in front of a computer so our goal is to provide meaningful learning experiences that will engage them. In turn, the children and families are sharing videos and pictures with us! We are using an app called Brightwheel to send lesson plans and information. We will soon begin to have Zoom sessions with our classes.

We miss the children and their families so very much and eagerly look forward to the time we can get back to our classrooms! I pray that our Heavenly Father will bless and keep you all safe and healthy during this difficult time.

FINANCIAL NOTES

Offering update provided for the first three months of 2020

As part of our ongoing communication efforts, we are pleased to provide you with this quarterly financial update for the first quarter (through March 2020).

The weekly envelope giving has totaled \$59,901 through the end of the first quarter. This is less than the budget amount of \$67,000. Even though we are unable to meet in person, your ongoing support via mailed offerings and/or online giving has been fantastic. Even in these difficult times, we have much to be thankful for as the church continues to do God's Work. Thank you for your generosity!

A few other items to highlight:

- We have a net deficit through the first quarter of the year of \$(7,892).
 - We had negative investment income in the quarter due to a decrease in the fair value of investments that were given to the church in prior years. We do expect the investment value to increase as the overall market improves.
 - The Board and our staff continue to be diligent in managing expenses wherever possible given the current situation.
- Remember that Vanco e-giving can be a very convenient option. There are two ways to give: via the website or via the "GivePlus" app that can be downloaded from the app store. Both are very straightforward and additional fund options have been added for your convenience.

The Board hopes you find this update valuable, and we thank you for your continued support. Please let us know if you have any questions.
