
CONFESSION & FORGIVENESS



GOSPEL READING

Luke 24:1-12, 36-53

SERMON

THE CORINTHIAN CREED

1 Corinthians 15:1-11

First Corinthians 15 records one of the earliest creeds or confessions of faith. Paul writes,

- "I would remind you of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain. For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that...
- Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, that He was buried, that He was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve."

All of these aspects of our faith are essential: Christ's death, burial, and resurrection, as well as His appearance to the disciples (and hundreds of others) to demonstrate the truth of God's promises. Without the Resurrection, our faith would be meaningless. But Christ lives, and because He does, we can be confident that God's promises to us in Christ have been fulfilled.
