FROM OUR INTERIM PASTOR

Dear Members and Friends of Holy Cross,

Greetings in our Lord, Jesus Christ!

It was a bit like "old home week" for Christine and me when, on an August Sunday, we came to worship at Holy Cross when the guest pastor was the Rev. Dr. James Zwernemann, now retired in East Haddam. Pastor Zwernemann had been for many years the parish pastor at the Village Lutheran Church in Bronxville, New York, right across the street from Concordia College back when we were undergraduates there. One of the things we remember about "Pastor Z" was that, more often than not, he used various props in his preaching and teaching. On that Sunday here in August, it was no different.

If you were there that morning, you may recall that Pastor Zwernemann brought to the pulpit several bags full of small "gratitude journals" that he'd kept over many years. He'd found it to be a good and helpful discipline to begin or end the day by writing down things for which he was grateful to God. It might have been things that we regard as large or small – large things like recovering from illness or small things like finding an elusive parking space at just the right time. He spoke of being in many ways drawn closer to the Lord when he expressed praise and thanksgiving for the things that came his way through God's provision.

On that Sunday in August, he challenged us to begin keeping such lists and journals, especially if we hadn't done so before. While I keep a personal journal, I've never maintained daily entries. In fact, there have been times where weeks or even months have gone by. To review what I have written, though, is to see that I have often mentioned persons, things, experiences, and moments for which I'm grateful.

So, together with Pastor Z, I would encourage you occasionally to make a written list of things for which you are thankful to God. Once you start

writing, I'll predict that more and more items come to mind and, in reviewing such lists, you'll begin more and more to discern the goodness and generosity of God, and it will breed still more gratitude.

There's plenty of negativity in the world; it does us well to counter the negativity in our own lives by living in a state of joyful gratitude. Perhaps your list will become a gift to a friend or family member as you share certain items with them.

Speaking of gratitude and thanksgiving, do plan to gather with your Christian sisters and brothers on Thanksgiving Eve (Wednesday, November 27) at 7:30 p.m., for a service of Holy Communion ("eucharist" means "thanksgiving") on the eve of the national holiday. It will launch you into the holiday observance with the proper frame of mind, and will be another reminder of how good our God is.

PRESIDENT'S JOURNAL


Stillness

The holiday season is upon us as we move into November and along with the joy and anticipation is the sometimes overwhelming stress and busyness of the season. I am challenging myself and you to find stillness amidst whatever is going on in our lives. It is in stillness that we can listen for God's voice and sense God's presence.

I have been praying and meditating on these verses: "The Lord will fight for you, and you have only to be silent." (Exodus 14:14); "Be still, my soul; the Lord is on your side." (LSB 752:1); and "Be still, and know that I am God." (Psalm 46:10).

God has us in the palm of His hands. I have the most difficult time remembering this and being still; there is so much to do! The grip that chronic impetus for action has on me is overwhelming at times and I wonder if I can keep up with all of it. It is during these times that I most need stillness and to be aware of God's presence in my life. I cannot discern the Holy Spirit's guidance when my mind is running at 100 miles an hour and my pace exceeds my focus. I can only hope to connect with people when I am present and engaged, listening and watching, acknowledging and letting go of the mental tugs and thoughts passing through my mind. I am making stillness part of my daily practice and prayer.

After speaking with a number of dedicated and thoughtful leaders here at Holy Cross, I am pleased to report that David Bogen will be chairing our Call Committee. Dave has initiated outreach to committee members and is working with Pastor Morris and President Yeadon, with Pastor Flammann as our interim pastor and consultant for our pastoral vacancy. Please pray for Dave and the committee, and for the important work that is being undertaken. We had a



prayer vigil following the service on Sunday, September 29, for the work of the Call Committee. Cliff Schrock and I read the petitions² and the congregation responded with "Lord hear our prayer," followed by a moment of silence. Please find stillness and reflect on the petitions as shared:

- 1. For Spiritual Nourishment: Lord of all, grant that in this time of vacancy we would continue to be fed by Your Word which is able to sustain us into salvation, through Jesus Christ our Lord. LORD HEAR OUR PRAYER.
- 2. For Discernment: Holy Spirit, grant discernment to the Call Committee and all members of Holy Cross as they seek the next pastor to feed us with the Word and Sacrament, through Jesus Christ our Lord. LORD HEAR OUR PRAYER.
- 3. For Protection Against Spiritual Attack: O God, guard the Call Committee and all members of Holy Cross from assaults of the devil, assuring them of their identity in Jesus Christ our Lord. LORD HEAR OUR PRAYER.
- 4. For Families: Heavenly Father, You have established the family for Your glory and the furthering of Your kingdom. Grant strong faith to the families of Holy Cross that they would hold fast to Your promises, through Jesus Christ our Lord. LORD HEAR OUR PRAYER.
- 5. For the Next Pastor: Good Shepherd, You have called pastors to shepherd Your people, guiding them to You and feeding them with Your Word. Be with our next pastor, guide him, and prepare him for his service at Holy Cross, in Jesus name. LORD HEAR OUR PRAYER.
- 6. For the Members of Holy Cross: Gracious Lord, look with favor upon the people of Holy Cross. Grant us patience, zeal, and strong faith in You, through Jesus Christ our Lord. LORD HEAR OUR PRAYER.
- 7. For Wisdom: Jesus Christ, You are the Wisdom sent from God. Grant to all of us godly wisdom that we would look to You as an example and avoid pride, arrogance, and impatience. We ask this through Jesus Christ our Lord. LORD HEAR OUR PRAYER.

I end this month's article in a moment of silence following "Lord hear our prayer."

FINANCIAL NOTES

Offering update provided for the first nine months of 2019

As part of our ongoing communication efforts, we are pleased to provide you with this quarterly financial update for the third quarter (through September 2019).

The weekly envelope giving has totaled \$192,306 through the end of the third quarter. This is slightly more than the prior year but less than the budget amount of \$200,000. After a slow start to the year (primarily attributed to poor weather), the trend has been favorable. Thank you for your generosity!

A few other items to highlight:

- Additional Share the Hope offerings of \$13,117 were received this year that have been used for the new doors and other facility improvements that help keep our church wonderful (and safe!).
- We have a net deficit through the third quarter of the year of \$(9,747).
 - o Investment income has been higher than estimated and partially offset the shortfall of envelope giving.
 - Seasonal costs (such as snow removal) and property/maintenance costs were higher than anticipated. The
 increases were partially offset by lower professional staff/salary costs. The Board and our staff continue to be
 diligent in managing expenses wherever possible.
- Remember that Vanco e-giving can be a very convenient option online or via the app.

The Board hopes you find this update valuable, and we thank you for your continued support. Please let us know if you have any questions.



COVENANT TO CARE FOR CHILDREN

Annual "Giving Tree" will be presented by end of November

When you are out and about in stores, the Halloween decorations and candy have been replaced with Christmas items. And soon preparations for the Advent season and Christmas will be seen right here at Holy Cross, including the presentation of the annual Covenant to Care for Children "Giving Tree" poster. At the end of November look in the narthex for this "tree" poster filled with ornament tags. Later this month Mimose will have provided me with an updated list of children under her care, including a gift suggestion. For many of the children, this will be the only Christmas gift he or she will receive. Despite Mimose being out of the office on maternity leave, she will be working with me to make sure the Christmas wishes for the

children in her caseload are fulfilled. For those who may not know or realize this, the work Mimose does under the Covenant to Care Adopt-A-Social Worker agreement is done in her free time.

For the past two years we have also given each child a hat & mitten/glove set which was a very "warm" and welcoming addition to the Christmas gift, so we will be doing that again this year. At any time this month prior to seeing the "Giving Tree" poster, if you feel so moved to purchase a winter hat &
